## Indian PM Modi meets Chinese counterpart Li in Beijing

Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi meets his Chinese counterpart Li Keqiang today, the second day of his three-day visit to China. Mr Modi had met Chinese President Xi Jinping on Thursday in the **ancient city of Xi'an**, becoming the first world leader to be invited to Mr Xi's ancestral province of Shaanxi. The two leaders discussed a long-standing border dispute as well as India's bid to join the United Nations Security Council.

Mr Modi is also expected to sign off on deals worth US\$10 billion (S\$13.17 billion), including Chinese investments in India's rail network, during the trip. -
