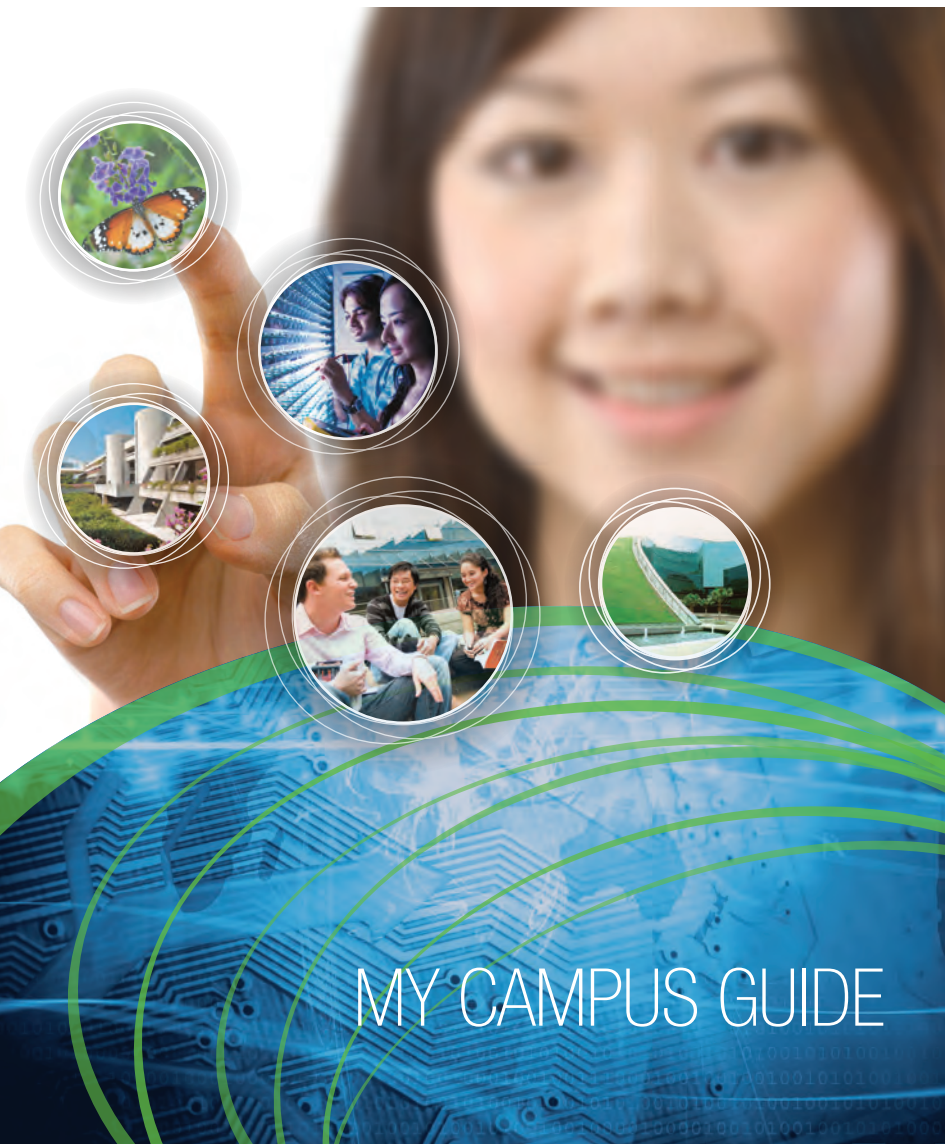

## ABOUT NTU

Nanyang Technological University (NTU) is a research-intensive university with globally acknowledged strengths in science and engineering. The university is ranked among the world's top 100 universities, while its Nanyang Business School is the leading business school in Singapore and has consistently been ranked among the top business schools in Asia.

Through its four colleges and three autonomous entities, the National Institute of Education, the S Rajaratnam School of International Studies and the Earth Observatory of Singapore, NTU provides a high-quality global education to more than 23,000 undergraduates and 10,000 graduate students. The student body includes top scholars and international Olympiad medallists from the region and beyond.

The Yunnan Garden campus, NTU's main campus, is located in the southwestern part of Singapore and will be the Youth Olympic Village of the inaugural Youth Olympic Games in 2010. The NTU@one-north campus, home to educational and alumni clubhouse facilities, is located next to the Biopolis, Singapore's biomedical research hub, and Fusionopolis, a new epicentre of engineering and physical sciences.

## DIVERSE DISCIPLINES FOR DIVERSE TALENTS

A research-intensive university, NTU offers a broad-based education where students can choose from a wide range of degree programmes, including degree courses unique to the university.

The College of Engineering has six schools focused on technology and innovation, and a research output among the top four in the world. The College of Science, with award-winning faculty and world-class laboratories, runs Singapore's only direct honours Bachelor's degree programmes in the biological, and physical and mathematical sciences. The Nanyang Business School (College of Business) is the first and only Singapore business school to be ranked in the top 30 of the Financial Times Global MBA Rankings 2010.

The College of Humanities, Arts, & Social Sciences is home to Singapore's first professional art school offering degree courses in art, design and media; a fast-growing humanities and social sciences school with distinctive niches of excellence; and the Wee Kim Wee School of Communication and Information, a top journalism and media school in Asia.

The National Institute of Education, Singapore's main teacher education institute, is internationally-acclaimed and provides educational consultancy to countries from Abu Dhabi to Vietnam.

The S Rajaratnam School of International Studies, an autonomous graduate institution of NTU, runs the Institute of Defence and Strategic Studies, an established world authority on strategic studies and security research.

The Earth Observatory of Singapore, established in 2008 with S\$150 million in state funding, is dedicated to hazards-related earth science.

## GLOBAL OUTREACH

NTU grows from strength to strength as Singapore's science and technology university, with a network of over 400 partners from Europe, North America and Asia. While building on its strengths in science, engineering and business, NTU has been developing complementary strengths in the humanities, arts and social sciences through strategic partnerships.

## MILESTONES

**1955** Nanyang University (Nantah) is established as the first Chinese-language university outside China. It is funded through donations from people from all walks of life.

**1981** Nanyang Technological Institute (NTI) is established with three Schools of Engineering on the premises of the former Nanyang University. Lessons are conducted in English.

**1991** NTI becomes Nanyang Technological University (NTU) with the absorption of the National Institute of Education, which becomes an autonomous institute of NTU.

**2005** NTU celebrates its 50th anniversary, unifying alumni from the various chapters of its heritage – Nanyang University, NTI and NTU.

**2006** A Board of Trustees is established as a key pillar of university governance with the corporatisation of NTU.

**2007** NTU's second campus, NTU@one-north, and the NTU Alumni Clubhouse officially open.

**2008** NTU partners the Ewing Marion Kauffman Foundation, establishing the first Kauffman Campus outside of the United States to promote entrepreneurship in Asia.

**2009** NTU becomes one of the seven founding members of the Global Alliance of Technological Universities, a network of the world's top technological universities that seeks to address global issues through leading-edge science and technology.







## THE YUNNAN GARDEN CAMPUS

The Yunnan Garden campus provides a serene backdrop to 16 Halls of Residence housing some 9,200 students and a variety of lodging options, including accommodation for 600 graduate students. Eight new halls are being built. All new undergraduates are guaranteed a place in a hall of residence.

### ACADEMIC

Comprises the North Academic Complex, commonly referred to as North Spine or abbreviated as N or NS with an accompanying block number. Similarly, the South Academic Complex is referred to as South Spine or abbreviated as S or SS with an accompanying block number.

### RESIDENTIAL

The zones are further defined by staff, graduate and undergraduate housing.

### DIRECTIONS

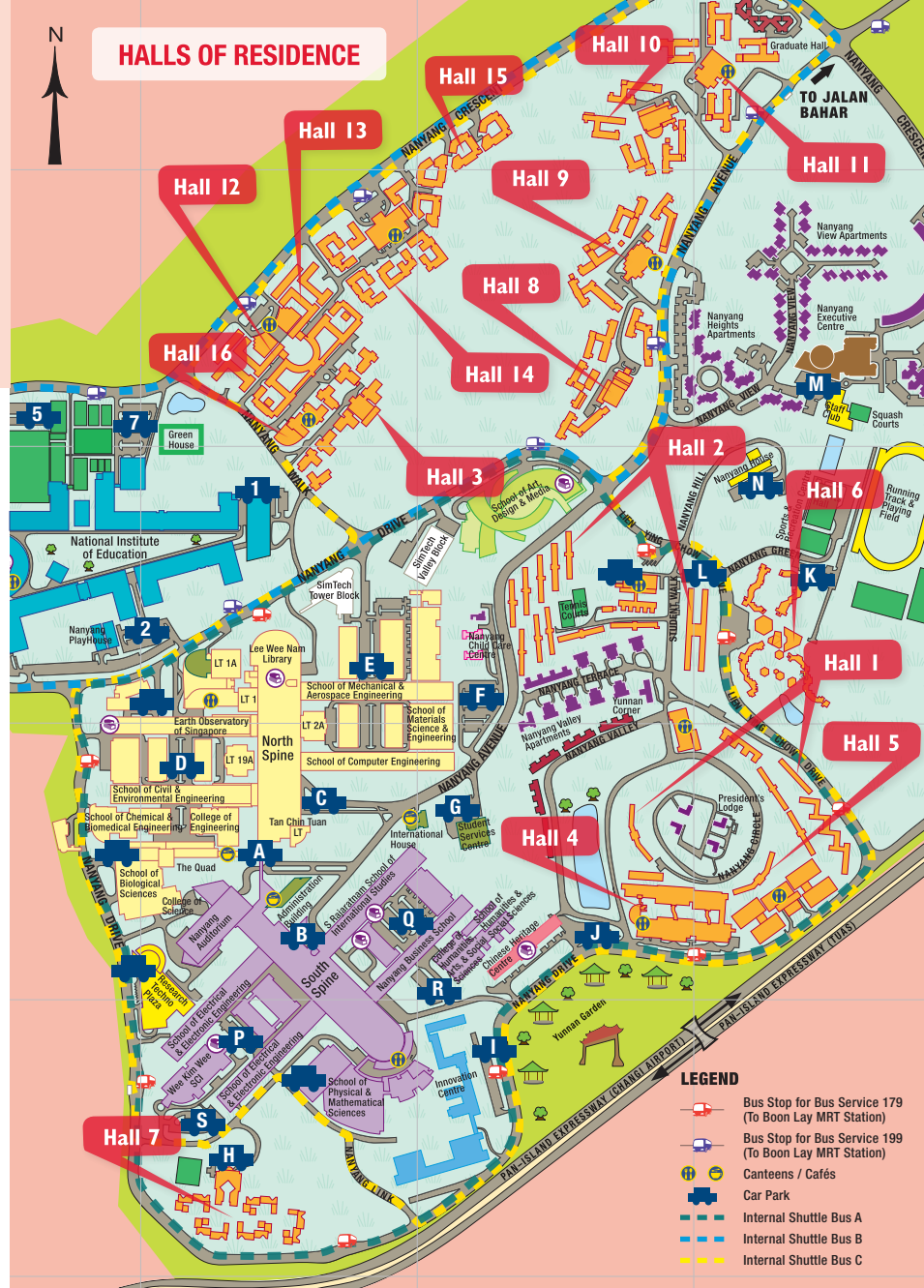
Located in the south-western part of Singapore in a 200-hectare garden campus, NTU's major buildings can be accessed via the four main arterial roads – Nanyang Avenue, Nanyang Drive, Lien Ying Chow Drive and Nanyang Crescent.

## ON-CAMPUS LIVING

NTU has the largest on-campus residence infrastructure in Singapore. About 38% of full-time undergraduates and 83% of international students live on campus. Some 600 housing units are set aside for international academics and staff members. The campus community forms a massive family unit, actively engaged in social exchange and mutual help.

## INAUGURAL YOUTH OLYMPIC VILLAGE

In August 2010, NTU will extend a warm welcome to more than 3,500 international athletes and 900 officials as the Youth Olympic Village for the inaugural Youth Olympic Games. The National Institute of Education will serve as the central square, while athletes will be staying at halls of residence around the university.





## NTU@ONE-NORTH CAMPUS

Officially opened by Mr S R Nathan, President of Singapore, NTU Chancellor and Patron of the NTU Alumni Club, on 8 May 2007, NTU's second campus in Singapore consists of an educational wing and the university's alumni clubhouse.

- ACADEMIC** The educational wing is home to the European Union Centre in Singapore, Confucius Institute and Centre for Continuing Education, in addition to lecture theatres, seminar rooms, an auditorium, computer laboratories and a café.
- CLUB** The NTU Alumni Club wing offers state-of-the-art facilities that include a fun pool, resort spa, wine bar, Chinese restaurant, games arcade, lounge, gymnasium, childcare centre, as well as karaoke rooms and other attractions.
- LOCATION** Located off North Buona Vista Road, the campus is near Singapore's biomedical research hub, Biopolis, and the new epicentre of engineering and physical sciences, Fusionopolis.

- MRT** Via the East-West line, alight at Buona Vista Station.  
Cross the overhead bridge and walk along North Buona Vista Road towards the Ministry of Education (MOE) building. NTU@one-north is located behind the MOE building.
- CAR** Via AYE, take North Buona Vista exit (Exit 8) and turn into Slim Barracks Rise.  
Via Commonwealth Avenue, take North Buona Vista Road and turn into Slim Barracks Rise.

## SOME NTU LANDMARKS

### ADMINISTRATION BUILDING

This building houses various administrative offices, including the President's Office.

### ADM

The School of Art, Design & Media (ADM) is Singapore's first professional art school offering degree courses in art, design and interactive media.

### CHINESE HERITAGE CENTRE

Once the seat of the Nanyang University administration, this historical building was gazetted a National Monument on 18 December 1998.

### INTERNATIONAL HOUSE

Home to the International Student Centre, which serves more than 8,000 international students from 80 countries, and provides assistance and advice on matters such as accommodation and immigration.

### NANYANG AUDITORIUM

The Nanyang Auditorium, with a seating capacity of 1,800, is the venue for Convocation ceremonies and concerts.

### NANYANG EXECUTIVE CENTRE

A dual-function centre designed to cater to the growing demand for NTU's executive programmes. Housing the Institute of Advanced Studies, it has an auditorium, lecture theatres, function halls and guestrooms.

### NORTH SPINE

Five of the engineering schools of the College of Engineering are housed in this complex.

### RESEARCH TECHNOPLAZA

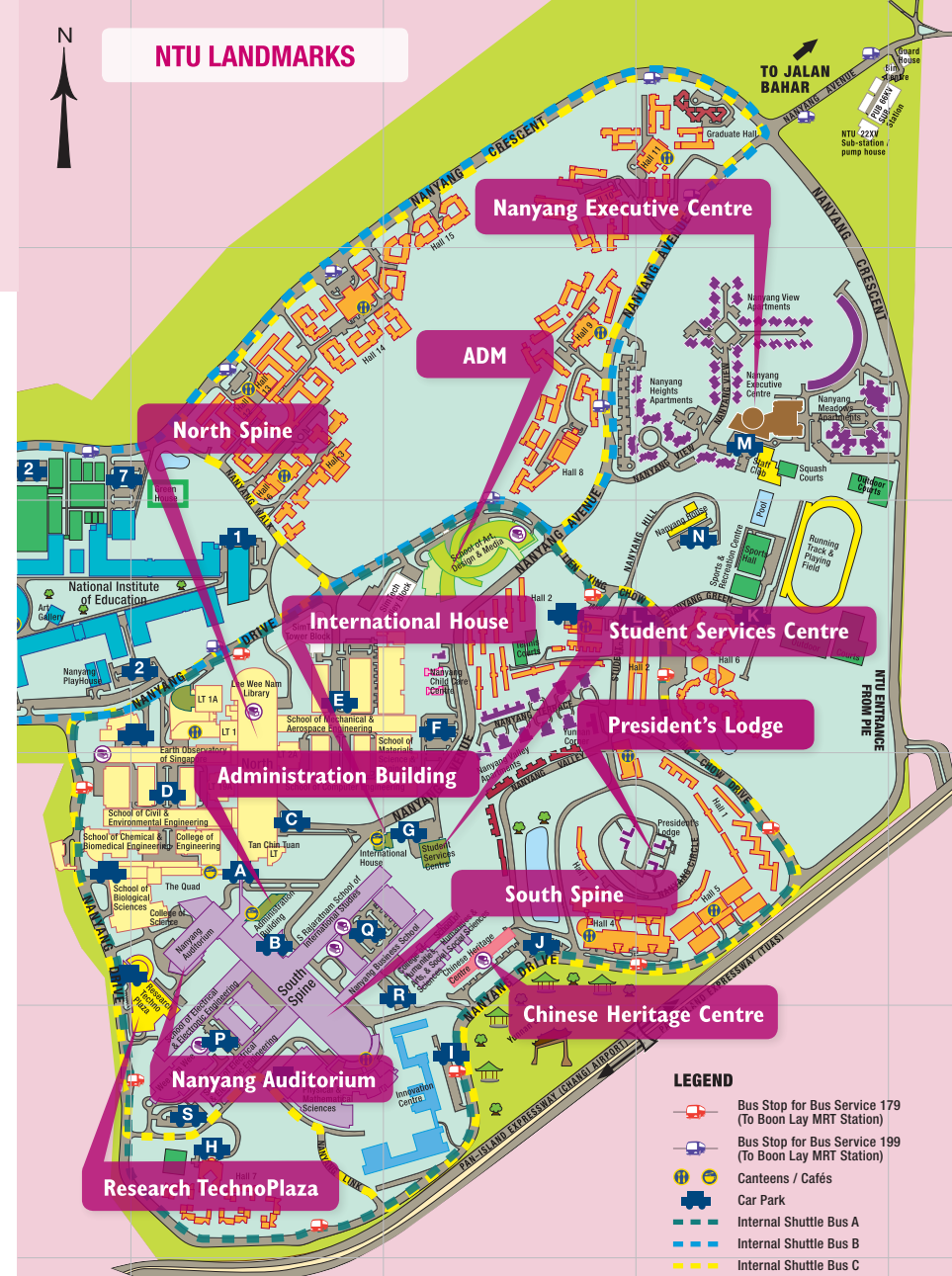
Home to interdisciplinary research clusters and research centres such as Temasek Laboratories@NTU, the Biomedical Engineering Research Centre, Thales@NTU, the Nanyang Technopreneurship Centre (NTC) and the Reality Theatre.

### SOUTH SPINE

The Nanyang Business School, School of Electrical & Electronic Engineering and S Rajaratnam School of International Studies are located here.

### STUDENT SERVICES CENTRE

This building houses administrative departments that provide services to students, including admissions services and financial aid, hall accommodation, and support for student activities.

Car parks are usually identified by signboards at the entrance to the car park. Public parking lots are marked in white while season lots are marked in yellow. Parking for residents is located near the halls and staff residences.
