#### NTU celebrates alumni achievements and fosters closer alumni ties

Besides the programme, guests will also be treated to cultural performances by current NTU students from the NTU Cultural Activities Club as well as alumni.

Each Nanyang Alumni Awards recipient will receive a specially commissioned Trophy and a Certificate of Commendation. The design of the trophy incorporates the elements of nature and embodies an admiration for and appreciation of ancient Chinese art, particularly, bronze artifacts and classic jade. Although shaped like a jade tablet ( $\pm$ ), it is also reminiscent of the obelisk, a monumental sculptural form commonly used in the West to commemorate important events.
