
CURRICULUM STRUCTURE (OVERVIEW)



Notes:

- One academic unit = One hour of lecture/tutorial per week or 3 hours of lab/fieldwork per week.
- 2. Major Core courses are compulsory courses required to satisfy programme requirements. Major Prescribed Electives are courses for specialisation in a particular degree programme and students can select them from a list of prescribed courses offered by their School.
- 3. General Education Requirement is the curriculum requirement for broadening study, which covers key fields of knowledge applicable to all students. The General Education Requirement constitutes about 25% to 40% of the total curriculum workload and is divided into 3 areas of studies as follows:
 - (a) Core Courses
- This includes courses relating to Human Resource Management, Communication Skills and Singapore Studies.
- (b) Prescribed Electives
- The courses are categorised into 3 sub-areas of studies relating to:
 - (i) Arts, Humanities & Social Sciences (AHSS)
 - (ii) Business & Management (BM)
 - Science, Technology & Society (STS)

These sub-areas represent the key fields of knowledge broadly relevant to all professions. The combination of courses to be read among these sub-areas varies according to the different needs of degree programmes. Students can select courses under each sub-area from a list of courses offered by the relevant Schools.

(c) Unrestricted Electives - These are courses chosen by students to broaden their learning experience. The Unrestricted Electives may cover any area offered by the various Schools and may not fall under the specific General Education Requirement Prescribed Electives categories of Arts, Humanities & Social Sciences, Science, Technology & Society and Business & Management. The Unrestricted Electives may also include modern languages, entrepreneurship, music and drama courses.
