

Wuhan University and NTU Partnership

A Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) was signed on 27 October 2006, between the Nanyang Technological University and Wuhan University (WHU), China on the joint education program of Master of Science (M. Sc.) in Power Engineering. The Wuhan University delegation, led by its Vice-President, Professor Wang Chuanzhong, visited NTU from 26 October 2006 to 30 October 2006. The MOU exchange ceremony was held in the School of Electrical and Electronic Engineering with Professor Kam Chan Hin, Chair, representing NTU during this ceremony.

Based on the terms of the MOU on the joint education program between NTU and WHU, up to 20 undergraduate students from WHU will join NTU in January 2007 to spend about 6 months on their final year projects under the supervision of the staff members from the Power Engineering Division of NTU. During this period, they will also undertake some English Language courses at NTU. After they graduate from WHU

in July 2007, these students will enroll as M. Sc. students in NTU for one year under the M. Sc. (Power Engineering) program. The number of incoming students from WHU will increase to up to 30 in each of the years 2008 and 2009. The joint education program will offer the students an exceptional global experience of language, culture, technology and knowledge.

It is anticipated that every year 3 to 4 academic staff members from WHU will visit the Power Engineering Division at NTU to jointly supervise the WHU students for their final year projects. The visit of the staff members from WHU will further strengthen the links and collaborations between WHU and NTU, in terms of joint research projects being formulated between the electrical engineering faculties of the two universities. It would be gratifying to see the current collaboration spread from the joint education programs to all areas including research and culture for the mutual benefit of students and staff of both universities.
