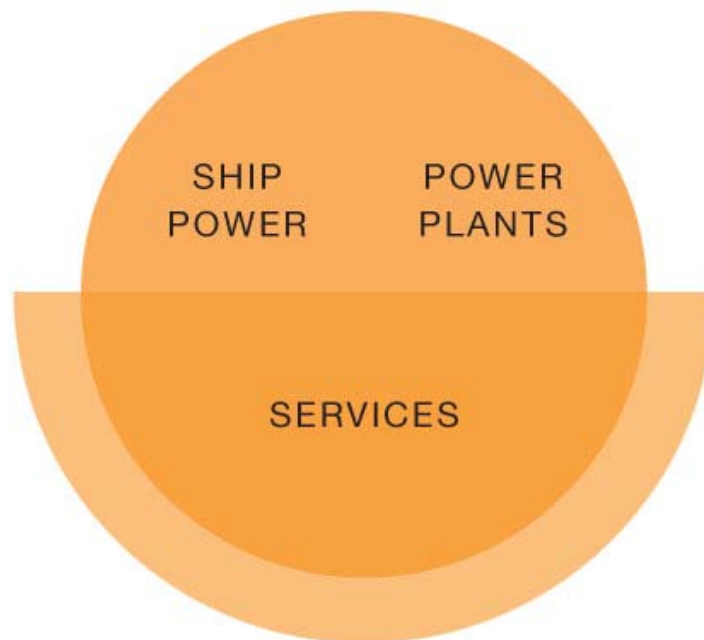

About Wärtsilä Singapore Scholar Programme & Eligibility

Wärtsilä Singapore Scholarship Programme is a premier undergraduate programme specially developed for the benefits of the students looking for a challenging career.

Objective:

1. To bring in new blood so as to inject new ideas and systems to sustain the growth of our company
2. To nurture new talents in engineering and management

The programme is designed for exceptional students with a deep passion for the marine and offshore business.

Highlights of the Programme

- a) The scholarship covers tuition fees plus miscellaneous fees. It also provides a monthly allowance of SGD500.00.
- b) Recipients are required to serve a bond of one year for every year of funding with the sponsoring company or its subsidiaries
- c) The scholarship is open to students presently pursuing their 2nd year Engineering course from the NTU Department of Mechanical Engineering specialising in Marine and Offshore Technology or NTU Department of Electrical and Computer Engineering or 1st year students from the Finance and Accounting Faculty.
- d) Candidates must be a Citizen or Permanent Resident of Singapore
- e) Candidates must have outstanding academic records from all his/her years of studies
- f) Recipients of the scholarship cannot hold any other scholarship, grant or award from other companies or University.
- g) Recipients must report to work at Wärtsilä Singapore or its overseas office during vacations and for all industrial attachment.
- h) The scholarship covers the entire duration of undergraduate studies on condition that scholars maintain a minimum CAP (Cumulative Average Point) of 4.0 (Second Class Upper Honours and above). The academic performance is monitored on a semester basis.
- i) If the scholar decides to terminate the scholarship prematurely, Wärtsilä reserves the right to impose a repayment .

Application and Shortlisting Procedure

- a) Candidates are requested to email their application to florence.lim@wartsila.com with a cover letter and supporting academic records. Leadership, co-curricular records and other capabilities will be assessed during the interview.
- b) Shortlisted candidates will be notified for a scholarship interview. Not all applicants for the scholarship will be called for an interview.
- c) Wärtsilä reserves the right not to award any scholarships if there are no candidates of sufficient merit. The decision of the selection committee comprising of representatives from Universities and Wartsila Singapore is final. Enquiries or disputes pertaining to its decision will not be entertained.

Points to note:

- There is a one year bond attached for each year of funding awarded.
- Application period runs from February to March.
- Screening and selection takes place in April through May.
- Scholarships are awarded by early June.
