Tuition Fees for AY2016-17 Freshmen

For students admitted to NTU in AY2016-17, the annual tuition fee is fixed at the AY2016-17 rate for the duration of their degree programme.

- 1. For Singapore Citizen and Singapore Permanent Resident students, the fee amounts quoted are exclusive of GST. The GST on the tuition fee is subsidised by MOE for these students.
- 2. For international students on subsidised tuition fees and students of all nationalities on non-subsidised tuition fees, the fee amounts quoted are inclusive of prevailing GST of 7%. GST is subject to change. GST on the tuition fee is to be borne by students.
- 3. Under the cohort-based fee system, tuition fee for a specific cohort of students will be fixed throughout the student's entire candidature.
- 4. The Tuition Fee payable for National Servicemen whose enrolment in the University is delayed by one or two years because of their National Service commitment, will be based on the prevailing tuition fees of the year they had first accepted a place in the University. For example, if they were offered admission in AY2014 and had accepted the offer, they pay the subsidised tuition fees applicable for AY2014 when they join the University in AY 2016. If they had re-applied for a new programme in AY2015, they will still pay the subsidised tuition fees applicable for AY2014 regardless of the 2nd application outcome.
- 5. The tuition fee rates are applicable for Semester 1 and 2 of an academic year. Fees (tuition fees and compulsory miscellaneous fees) are payable by students every semester of their study with the University, as long their status is active and not on semester leave of absence. The fees are fixed regardless of their academic load or whether they are on internship or exchange programme.

- 6. Students who withdraw or apply for leave of absence from the University after the 2nd Teaching Week are liable for the payment of fees (tuition fee and other compulsory fees) for the entire semester.
- 7. Full-time Singaporean and Singapore PR undergraduate students who gain admission or gain re-admission to NTU on a subsidised fee basis are eligible for Tuition Grant and GST subsidy from MOE up to the normal programme duration less the number of semesters of Tuition Grant received in the previous institution if any (i.e. NUS / NTU / SMU / SUTD / SIT / UniSIM / NAFA / LASALLE).

Full-time International undergraduate students who gain admission or gain re-admission to NTU on a subsidised fee basis are eligible for Tuition Grant from MOE up to the normal programme duration less the number of semesters of Tuition Grant received in the previous institution if any (i.e. NUS / NTU / SMU / SUTD / SIT / UniSIM / NAFA / LASALLE).

For students who have exceeded the normal programme duration (less the number of semesters of Tuition Grant received in the previous institution), they will no longer be eligible for the Tuition Grant and GST subsidy from MOE. NTU will however subsidise the tuition fees such that students pay a fee equivalent to the MOE subsidized fees up to their maximum candidature (less the number of semesters of Tuition Grant received in the previous institution and NTU). GST on the tuition fees is to be borne by the student.

For example, a Singaporean student had spent 2 semesters in a local university, and transfers to NTU to pursue a 4-year (i.e. 8 semesters) undergraduate programme with maximum duration of 6 years (12 semesters). The student will be eligible for the subsidized tuition fee for 10 semesters (12 minus 2). Tuition fees and GST for the first 6 semesters will be subsided by MOE. Tuition fees for the next 4 semesters will be subsidized by NTU and GST is to be borne by student.

- Students who are Singapore Citizens are required to sign a Declaration for Tuition Grant Eligibility form to facilitate NTU's assessment of their eligibility for the Tuition Grant to be eligible for subsidised tuition fees. Students who are found not to be eligible for the Tuition Grant will be charged the non-subsidised tuition fees.
- Singapore PR and International Students who are eligible for and intend to take up the Tuition Grant must apply for the Tuition Grant. Those eligible must sign a Tuition Grant Agreement, which will require them to work in Singapore-based companies for 3 years upon graduation from NTU. Those who are not eligible, or choose not to apply for the grant, are required to pay the non-subsidised fees.
