

# **Title: NTU wins S\$40 million worth of competitive research grants in sustainable development**

News Summary:

Four proposals from Nanyang Technological University (NTU), Singapore have won up to S\$40 million (US\$28 million) in research funds from the National Research Foundation, Singapore.

This follows NRF's fifth call for proposals under its Competitive Research Programme (CRP) Funding Scheme which awards up to S\$10 million for each successful research proposal, over three to five years.

The latest CRP call with the theme "Sustainable Urban Systems," saw NTU garnering four awards for proposals involving the development of new biofuels, the development of an underwater city, sustainable urban waste management, and the harvesting of sunlight to create chemical energy.
