Dengue Mosquito

Study revealed

Research on this has been done under the leadership of Singapore's Nanyang Technological University. Research has revealed that dengue patients have 55 percent more risk of heart diseases than COVID-19. In this study published in the Journal of Travel Medicine, more than 11,700 dengue patients and more than 12 lakh COVID-19 patients have been tested and medical data has been analyzed.

Dengue more dangerous than COVID-19

Lim Jue Tao, assistant professor of infectious disease modelling at Nanyang Technological University and lead author, said dengue is one of the most common vector-borne diseases globally. Dengue also causes many problems later on.

Scientists from Singapore say that after getting dengue, special precautions need to be taken regarding heart health. According to research, dengue can have serious effects on the body in many ways in the future. In many cases, liver damage, myocarditis and neurological problems are also likely to occur due to severe dengue.
