As Global Ambassadors, students collaborate with peers across borders on global challenges such as climate change, digital equity and sustainable development. They also get opportunities to represent NTU on prestigious international platforms and organise regionally inspired conferences that encourage dialogue and cooperation among youth worldwide.

The Game Changer pillar enables students to take intellectual ownership of their learning by designing and curating their own seminar series, often inviting international experts to share perspectives on emerging trends. Additionally, students interested in entrepreneurship can access the NTU Venture Creation Programme to bring their innovations to market.

Beyond these signature experiences, students in the Honours College are offered challenge-based learning opportunities that foster interdisciplinary collaboration and bold, creative thinking.
