

## **ASEAN UNDERGRADUATE SCHOLARSHIP - Offered in 2026**

### **TERMS AND CONDITIONS**

The Scholarship covers up to the normal programme duration on condition that the scholar maintains a record of good academic performance and conduct satisfactory to the University. Scholarship recipients must be citizens or permanent residents from the Association of South East Asian Nations (ASEAN), except Singapore.

1. The benefits of the Scholarship are as follows:
  - i. Subsidised tuition fees (after Tuition Grant)
  - ii. Living allowance of S\$5,800.00 per academic year
  - iii. Accommodation allowance of S\$3,000.00 per academic year
  - iv. Computer allowance of S\$1,750.00 (once only)
  
2. The Scholarship is awarded to you under the following terms and conditions:
  - i. **COURSE OF STUDY.** You have to pursue a full-time undergraduate degree programme leading to a first degree.
  - ii. **SCHOLAR'S OBLIGATIONS.** You are required to maintain a minimum Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) of 3.5 over 5.0 for the duration of your programme and your Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) must not be "nil" for semester 1 and 2. Your academic performance will be reviewed every semester.
  - iii. **BOND.** There is no bond attached to the Scholarship.
  - iv. **AGREEMENT.** You will be required, together with two (2) sureties to enter into an agreement with the University. The sureties must satisfy the following conditions:
    - a. Be 21 years and above up to 60 years of age (or up to 65 years of age for sureties who are Singapore Citizens or PRs);
    - b. Be gainfully employed;
    - c. Not be a party to an existing scholarship/bursary/study loan or any other deed/agreement;
    - d. Not be a bankrupt and
    - e. At most, only one parent or one member of the immediate family can act as one of the sureties.
  - v. You must not hold concurrently any other scholarships, bursaries or university loans (except for one time award or book prize) during the tenure of the Scholarship without the approval of the university.
  - vi. You are allowed to participate in overseas programmes only if you are within the following limits: At least 75% of the academic credits/units required for graduation are earned in Singapore and overseas programme must be completed before the second study week in the first semester of your final year of study.
  - vii. The Scholarship may be withdrawn at any time if, in the opinion of the University, your progress or behaviour is deemed unsatisfactory.
  - viii. During the duration of the programme, Office of Admissions has the discretion to send a copy of all scholarship warning letters/emails to parents of international students as and when issued to the scholarship recipient by the office.
  - ix. If you decide to terminate the scholarship prematurely, you are liable to refund all monies expended on you together with 10% compounded interest per annum.
  
3. You are required to take advantage of the Tuition Grant Scheme (TGS) which is offered by the Singapore Government. Under the TGS, all non-Singaporean scholars (including Singapore Permanent Residents), will be required to sign a TG agreement in which they will be contractually obliged to work in Singapore-registered companies for a minimum period of 3 years upon graduation.
